Hi Deke & Corrin,

The applicants are required to apply erosion control measures (straw wattles, silt fencing) prior to issuance of permit. I will tell them to remove the trash heap or to contain it in a dumpster.

The permits for Lots 9-11 have not been issued yet, pending approval of a detailed description of grading and erosion control operations. The applicant's plan at this time is to start on Lot 9 and 10 when the permits are issued and start Lot 11 in the spring.

I will let you know when permits are issued.
