The construction crew for the new storm drain at San Mateo Highlands Lot 11 left two large 8-foot deep open holes in the sidewalk and street at the end of Cowpens Way. Inside the holes there are uncapped steel rebar wires sticking up. Seems like there should be a fence around these open holes, for example to prevent the neighborhood kids from falling in and impaling themselves. Is it legal to leave unmarked and unfenced safety hazards on a construction site like this?
